



INTRODUCTION

The Central Zoo Authority was constituted on 3rd February 1992 to oversee and monitor the management of Zoos in the country in such a manner that they contribute significantly in the Ex-situ Conservation of rare and endangered species.




INFRASTRUCTURE

The conditions of service etc. of chairperson, Members and Member-Secretary of the Central Zoo Authority were finalised in consultation with the Ministry of Law and notified on 8.12.1992 (Annexure - 1). According to approved rules an interview for making selection of a suitable candidate for the post of Member-Secretary was held on 4.3.1993. The secretarial staff viz the Administrative Officer, the Accounts Officer and others were taken either on contract basis or on foreign service to make the

Zoo Authority functional pending formal creation of various posts by the competent authority.

MEMBERSHIP

Ms Sally Walker, Secretary Zoo outreach organisation was appointed as the 10th Member of the Zoo Authority vide Notification NO. 6-3/ 91-WL 1 of 1.4.92 (Annexure -II). Shri Ashish Chandola resigned the membership of the Central Zoo Authority and his resignation was accepted by the competent authority and in his place Ms Sheela Pasricha was appointed as Member, Central Zoo Authority vide Notification dated 4th May 1992 (Annexure -III). It was decided by the Authority that the President of the Indian Zoo Directors Association, Chairman Animal Welfare Board and the Additional Inspector General (Forests) should be the permanent invitees in the meetings of the Zoo Authority.

NOTIFICATION OF STANDARDS & NORMS FOR OPERATION OF ZOOS IN THE COUNTRY

The Wild Life (Protection) Act 1972 provides that no zoo shall be operated in the country without being recognised by the Central Zoo Authority. Every recognition by the Central Zoo Authority shall specify the conditions, if any, subject to which the Zoo shall be operated. The recognition can be granted after having due regard to the interest of protection and conservation of Wild Life and the prescribed Standards & Norms as under Section 38H of the Act.

In these Circumstances, the foremost task before the Central Zoo Authority was to finalise the Application Form for recognition and the Standards & Norms subject to which the zoos can operate.

The proposals formulated by the Sub-Committee constituted for the purpose were placed before the Central Zoo Authority in its meeting held on 6.4.92 for consideration and approval. After obtaining the approval of the Authority, the draft Standards & Norms were circulated to the Chief Wild Life Wardens and the Directors of various Zoos inviting their comments. After consideration of the comments received from the Chief Wild Life Wardens and Zoo Directors, the Application Form and the Standards & Norms subject to which the recognition has to be granted were finalised in consultation with the Legislative Department of the Ministry of Law and were notified on 4th August 1992 as Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992. A booklet containing these rules with a foreword by the Chairman, Central Zoo Authority/Minister of State for Environment & Forests was printed and made available to all concerned.

APPLICATIONS FOR RECOGNITION

According to Section 38H of the Wild Life (Protection) Act the Zoos which were already in existence at the time of the Act coming into

force had to make applications for recognition within 6 months of the 4th February 1992. As this period had already elapsed before the Zoo Rules, 1992 could be notified, the Central Zoo Authority decided to extend the period for making aplications till 3rd August 1993. The Central Government issued an ordinance in this regard on 23.10.92 which was subsequently replaced by an Act of Parliament.

In the meantime the letters were addressed by the Chairman, Central Zoo Authority; Secretary (Environment & Forests) and the Member-Secretary, Central Zoo Authority to the State Governments and the Zoo Directors to make applications for recognition within the prescribed time limit. Advertisement in the national and local newspapers was also given to this effect to ensure that all concerned are duly informed in time.

As a result of these efforts, 143 applications for recognitions were received till 31st March 1993 (Annexure -IV)

ORGANISATION OF LOGO CONTEST.

In order to create awareness about the role of the Zoo Authority in wild life conservation at National level, the Zoo Authority decided in its meeting held on 4th August, 1992 to organise a logo contest for selecting a suitable Logo for the Authority. Wide publicity to the role and objectives of the Central Zoo Authority was made in the national and local newspapers through advertisements for the Logo Contest. In all 1387 entries from different parts of the Country were received. The entries were submitted by all agegroups and persons from all walks of life. Although some entries were quite imaginative, no entry was found fit for adoption as the Logo of the Authority. Centre for Environment Education, Ahmedabad has now been requested to develop a logo for the Authority using the ideas from the selected entries.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ZOOS.

The Central Zoo Authority decided to provide financial assistance to different Zoos in the country mainly for the following works and accordingly the proposals were invited from the Zoos vide letter No. 13-2/92 - CZA dated July 20, 1992.

- (i) Improvement of animal housing and enclosures.
- (ii) Improvement of water supply for the animals.
- (iii) Upgradation of veterinary facilities.
- (iv) Arrangement for hygeinic storage of food for feeding animals.
- (v) Captive breeding programme for rare and endangered species.

- (vi) Development of better signage aiming at adequate scientific information to the visitors.
- (vii) Programme for exchange & breeding loans between different Zoos.
- (viii) Construction of boundary wall.

During 1992-93 the Central Zoo Authority received grant-in-aid of Rs. 75 lacs from the Ministry of Environment & Forests. Out of this, financial assistance amounting to Rs.72,85,500/- was released to the different zoos after proper scrutiny of the proposals. Summary of the assistance released is as follows:

Captive breeding of endangered species is one of the main concerns of the Zoo Authority. The Central Zoo Authority in its meeting held on 4th August 1992, therefore, constituted a captive Breeding Specialist Group comprising the following as members:

The Group met on 15th September 1992 and identified the species coordinators and the participating zoos in the cooperative programme of a number of species. The list of species identified for captive breeding is placed at Annexure - V.



PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION MARK ON ANIMALS

In the fourth meeting of the Zoo Authority, it was decided that for carrying out Captive Breeding Programme of endangered species on scientific lines, it is essential to have a permanent identification mark on the animals involved in the Captive Breeding Programme. With this fact in view, it was decided to accept a gift of 400 transponders and 10 scanners from the KOLN Zoo (Germany) and use the same for identification of species under the overall guidance of Director, Wild Life Institute, Dehradun.

RUNNING OF EATING HOUSES INSIDE THE ZOOS

The members of the Authority were of

unanimous view that considerable harm is caused to the Zoos by the visitors by throwing away half eaten food packets in the zoo campus. There have been instances where such packets have resulted in the death of some animals. The tendency of feeding the animals by the visitors is also noticed. The Chairman of the Authority therefore appealed to all the State Governments to consider shifting the restaurants outside the zoo premises. The parlours for tea, coffee and cold drinks could, however, continue. The response of State Governments has been quite positive and several zoos have shifted the restaurants and eating houses outside the zoo campus.

INVOLVEMENT OF STUDENTS IN THE MANAGEMENT OF ZOOS

There is realisation amongest the members of the Central Zoo Authority that involvement of students from selected institutions can bring out a drastic improvements in the cleanliness and hygeinic upkeep of the animals. It was, therefore, decided to evolve a detailed mechanism for involvement of students in the zoo management in such a manner that the safety of the animals as well as the students is ensured. The need for close coordination between the zoo staff and the students in also of vital importance. Detailed consultation with members and zoo Directors were held in this regard.

EXCHANGE PROPOSALS

It was decided that primary objective of the exchange programme amongst the Indian Zoos and foreign zoos should be the ex-situ conservation of the species. No zoo is allowed to acquire animal if the climatic conditions and the housing facilities are not congenial to a particular species. With this fact in view several proposals for exchange of animals within the country as well as the foreign zoos were approved. The list is placed at Anneure - VI.

GIFT OF ASIATIC LIONS TO HELSINKI ZOO

The Central zoo Authority in its 2nd meeting decided to gift one male and two female Indian Lions to the Helsinki Zoo on the request of the Government of Finland to prmote further collaboration between the Indian Zoos and Helsinki Zoo and strengthen the bonds of freindship between India and Finland more particularly in the area of nature conservation. These animals were presented by Minister of Environment & Forests/Chairman, Central Zoo Authority during his visit to Finland.

A pair of grey jungle fowl was also gifted by the Minister of Environment and Forests/Chairman, Central Zoo Authority of India to Crown Prince of Japan.

CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY FUND

The Wild Life (Protection) Act 1972 as amended in 1991 provides for the Constitution

of a fund to be called the Central

Fund where in besides grants etc. from the Central Government, all sums received by the Authority from such other sources as may be decided upon by the Central Government are to be credited. The grant-in-aid from the Central Government being not sufficient enough to meet the requirements of the various zoos in India, it was considered necessary to incorporate in the proposed Fund Rules a provision for obtaining donations from Individuals, Corporate and non-corporate bodies, International Institutions and Non-Resident Indians. In order to attract donations the Ministry of Finance was approached to allow tax concession to such donors.

APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS

The Comptroller and Auditor General was approached through the Ministry of Finance for appointment of auditors for the Zoo Authority and also to prescribe the format of annual Statement of Accounts. The Director of Audit, Scientific Departments has since been appointed auditors to carry out the audit of Central Zoo Authority.

A copy of the Annual Accounts of the Central Zoo Authority for the Year 1992-93 containing Receipts and Payments Account, Income & Expenditure Accounts and Balance Sheet together with the Audit Certificate are placed at Annexure-VII.

- G.S.R. 601-In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 63 of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 (53 of 1972), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules regulating the conditions of service etc., of chairperson, members and Member-Secretary of the Central Zoo Authority, namely:
- 1. Short titile and commencement-(1) These rules may be called the chairperson, members and Member-Secretary of the Central Zoo Authority (conditions of service) Rules 1992.
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazzette.
- 2. Definitions In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires -
 - (a) "Act" means the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 (53 of 1972);
 - (b) "Authority" means the Central Zoo Authority constituted under section 38A;
 - (c) "Chairperson" means the Chairperson of the Authority appointed under section 38A;
 - (d) "Fund" means the Central Zoo Authority Fund Constituted under sub-section (2) of section 38E;
 - (e) "Member" means the member of the Authority appointed under section 38A;
 - (f) "Member-Secretary" means the Member-Secretary of the Authority appointed under section 38A;
 - (g) "section" means section of the Act;
 - (h) All other words and expressions used in these rules were not defined but defined in the Act shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.
- 3. Travelling and other allowance to the chairperson and members-(1) The chairperson and members shall be entitled to draw from the Fund the travelling and daily allowance for journey performed for attending the meetings of the Authority or for the purpose of discharging such duties as may be assigned to them by the Authority, at the highest rate admissible to Grade I Officer of the Central Government.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-rule (1), the chairperson or any other member, who is a member of Parliament or of the State Legislature, shall not be entitled to any remuneration other then the allowances as defined in clause (a) of section 2 of the Parliament (Prevention of Disqualification) Act, 1959 (10 of 1959) or as the case may be, other then the allowances, if any, which a member of the Legislature of the State may, under any law for the time being in force in the State relating to the prevention of disqualification for membership of the State Legislature, receive without incurring such disqualification.

- (3) No travelling and daily allowance shall be allowed to the chairperson or any member unless he certifies that he has not drawn any travelling or daily allowance from any other source in respect of the journey and halt for which the claim is made.
- 4 Appointment of Member-Secretary-(1) The Central Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint a Member-Secretary who shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as assigned to him by the Chairperson.
- (2) Subject to relaxation for SC/ST candidates as laid down by the Central Government, no person above the age of fifty five years shall be appointed as Member-Secretary and shall not remain in the office after attaining the age of sixty years.
- (3) A person to be appointed as Member-Secretary shall have the following essential and desirable qualifications:

Essential Qualifications:

- (a) Master's degree in Zoology or Wild Life Biology or Veterinery Science of a recognised University or equivalent, with twenty years experience in the post equivalent to Group 'A' post of the Central Government; or
- (b) Ph. D. degree of a recognised University in Zoology, or Wild Life Biology or Veterinary Science with 15 years experience in the post equivalent to Group 'A' post of the Central Government;
- (c) Indian Forest Service Officers serving as Conservator or Forests or in an equivalant rank having twenty years regular service with reference to year of allotment;
- (d) Out of the service indicated in (a), (b) and (c) above, the person must have at least 3 years experience as whole time Director/Officer-in-Charge of a Zoo.

Desirable-Experience in formulation of policies and programme on matters relating to wildlife conservtion

5. Salary and allowances of the Member-Secretary-The Member-Secretary shall be entitled to the salary in the pay scale of Rupees 5900-200-6700 and shall be entitled to draw travelling and daily allowance at the highest rate admissable to Grade I Officer of the Central Government.


