

CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

Role of the Central Zoo Authority

Zoos are among the institutions of antiquity, that have survived a number of transitions. The present generations of zoos in India represent the age of control and had their origin as small animal collections attached to gardens and parks. The first public zoo in India was set up at Madras in 1854. This was followed up by setting up of several zoos by various princely states like Trivandrum, Junagarh, Jaipur, Baroda, Udaipur, Bikaner and Jodhpur. Public zoos were also established during the same period at Bombay and Calcutta. Zoos were established at Lucknow and Gwalior in 1921. These zoos, mainly aimed at providing the city-dwellers an opportunity to pass their leisure time with their family members under picturesque surroundings. The superintendents and the directors of the zoos had more of a park mentality and were concerned little about the health and upkeep of the animals.

Government of India has been quite sensitive to the role of zoos as awareness centres for wildlife conservation. It decided to establish the first naturalistic and moated zoo at Delhi, soon after the independence. Several State governments followed suit and large, naturalistic zoos were set up at Hyderabad, Guwahati, Chandigarh, Kanpur, Bhopal, Patna, Bhubaneswar, Vishakhapatnam, Madras and Tirupati.

However, owing to rapid industrialization and urbanization, the need for quick recreation became a feature of time and more and more

new animal facilities, which paid little attention to the welfare aspects of animals and often subjected animals to cruelties, were created. The Central Zoo Authority has been set up by the central government to stop the mushrooming of these unplanned and illconceived zoos and to provide to the existing zoos of the country a orientation that can provide the zoo inmates quality of life that is congenial to their mental and physical health. This is crucial for planned breeding and getting genetically and socially viable progeny from the animals of endangered species.

The main functions of the Central Zoo Authority, assigned under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, are:

- (a) to specify the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in a zoo;
- (b) to evaluate and assess the functioning of the zoos with respect to the prescribed standards or norms;
- (c) to recognise or derecognise zoos;
- (d) to identify endangered species of wild animals for purposes of captive breeding and assigning responsibility in this regard to a zoo;
- (e) to coordinate the acquisition, exchange and loaning of animals for breeding purpose;
- (f) to ensure maintenance of stud books of endangered species of wild animals bred in captivity;

- (g) to identify priorities and themes with regard to display of captive animals in a zoo;
- (h) to coordinate training of zoo personnel in India and outside India;
- (i) to coordinate research in captive breeding and educational programmes for the purpose of zoos;
- (j) to provide technical and other assistance to zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- (k) to perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act with regard to zoos.

The Central Zoo Authority was constituted on 4.2.1992 with the Minister of Environment and Forests as Chairman. The Authority was reconstituted on the 3rd February, 1995. It's present constitution is as follows:

CHAPTER II


IMPORTANT DECISIONS OF THE CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY

The meetings of the Central Zoo Authority were held on 28th July, 1995 and the 5th January, 1996. Important matters considered in the meetings and the decisions taken by the authority, briefly, are:

- 1. The substandard zoos affect the public image of zoos. Therefore, it was decided that no recognition should be granted to the zoos which are not in a position to come up to the standards and norms prescribed under the "Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992" and the provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- 2. To facilitate the upgradation and modernization of the management of zoos, the zoos should be asked to create technical and scientific posts on their staff.
- 3. The management of National Zoological Park, Delhi should be handed over to an autonomous society specially created for

the purpose, for making the management of the zoo more responsive and sensitive to the needs of animals.

- 4. To organise visits of the slum school children to zoos for inculcating in them the empathy for wild animals.
- 5. Draft National Zoo Policy was placed for approval of the authority. However, the authority decided to get the views of State government to take a final view in the matter.
- 6. The role of zoos as rescue centres often affects their potential as centres for conservation awareness. Therefore, separate facilities for housing the rescued animals should be provided either in off-the-display areas of the zoo or as satellites to the zoo. The budget for rescue centres should be provided by the State government.



CHAPTER III

EVALUATION AND GRANT OF RECOGNITION TO ZOOS

During the year under report, 5 medium zoos, 14 small zoos, 28 mini zoos and 16 mobile zoos were evaluated. On the basis of evaluation


report recognition has been granted to 5 medium zoos, 13 small zoos and 22 mini zoos. The list of these zoos is given below:




CHAPTER - IV

PLANNED BREEDING OF ENDANGERED SPECIES

- 1. A workshop was organised on planned breeding of Red panda at Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, Darjeeling with the help of European breeding programme Red panda specialist group; American species survival plan and International Red panda management group. Dr. Roberts Miles from USA; Dr. Peter Bircher from UK and Dr. Angela Glaston from Rotterdam Zoo gave very informative presentation on the morphology, health care and breeding of Red panda.
- 2. As a follow up measure of the Red panda workshop, the zoo veterinarian and animal



- 3. A meeting of zoo directors was held at Sasan (Gir) on the 7th May, 1995 to discuss the strategy for planned breeding of Asiatic lion and Wild ass.
- 4. As a follow up measure of the decision to take up planned breeding of tigers, a meeting of the zoo directors was held at Bhopal on 24.2.1996 in which the scheme for movement of the tigers of wild origin and that of pure wild lineage was finalised.





Zoo Animal Exchange Programme:

The technical committee of the Central Zoo Authority met on 6.6.1995, 27.7.1995, 14.11.1995, 14.1.1996 and 16.3.1996 to discuss and decide on exchange of animals pertaining to endangered species. On the basis of these recommendations and under the powers deligated to Member Secretary, exchange programmes as given in annexure I were approved. The exchange programmes were approved keeping

in view the overall interest of the conservation of these species.

CHAPTER - V

EDUCATION AND AWARENESS

The Central Zoo Authority and the Indian Zoo Directors Association continued to bring out the quarterly journal on important aspects of zoo management in the country. It was also decided to bring out a zoo year book for the country. The year book is under printing and would be released shortly.

- 2. During wildlife week, a special drive was organised, with the cooperation of National Zoological Park, Delhi, to bring slum school children to the zoo and inculcate in them empathy for wildlife.
- 3. Financial assistance was provided to a local NGO "Vatavaran" to conduct a zoo education programme for school children of Delhi.
- 4. Nandankanan Biological Park, Bhubaneswar organised zoo guide services for conducting the visitors round the zoo, to make their visits more rewarding and interesting.
- 5. (A project to make a film "Zoos Centres of Conservation" was awarded to M/s. Multi Media. By the end of the financial year the film was ready and awaiting approval.



CHAPTER - VI

RESEARCH AND TRAINING

Wildlife Institute of India, organised a Capsule course for zoo supervisors at Shri Chamarajendra Zoological Park, Mysore from 27.11.1995 to 9.12.1995. The course was attended by 38 officials from various States.

- 2. During the year, programmes for training of the zoo keepers were organised at Kanpur and Bhubaneswar. At Kanpur 21 keepers from Hindi speaking States and at Bhubaneswar 11 keepers from Bangla and Oriya speaking States participated.
- 3. Shri A. S. Dogra, Director, Chhatbir Zoological Park, Chandigarh and Dr. K.C. Patro from Nandankanan Biological Park, Bhubaneswar participated in a training programme on conservation of endangered

species at Jersey Wildlife Preservation Trust, United Kingdom from 31.7.1995 to 19.8.1995.

- 4. Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority participated in the Strategic Future Workshop for zoos held at Kolon, Germany during May, 1995.
- 5. Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority participated in the meeting of the Conservation Breeding Specialist Group and International Union of the Directors of Zoological Gardens held at Dublin from 27.9.1995 to 5.10.1995.
- 6. The Central Zoo Authority in the collaboration with CBSG, India organised a Population and Habitat Viability Analysis (PHVA) workshop for Swamp deer at Dehradun in July, 1995.



CHAPTER - VII

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

- 1. Lufthansa provided free trip to the Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority from Delhi to Dublin and back for participating in the CBSG and International Union of the Directors of Zoological Gardens, on the instance of the President, International Union of Zoo Directors.
- 2. Workshops on management of invertebrates and plants were held in various zoos of the country with the help of British Council and British Airways, through the efforts of Zoo Outreach Organisation.

Desai continued to work on consultancy basis for evaluation of zoos and provided technical assistance to the Member Secretary on various aspects of zoo management, including zoo designing.

CHAPTER - IX
