CHAPTER-I

THE CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY

Traditionally Zoos were seen as centres of recreation. But in recent years, they have been assigned the responsibility of being "Centres of Conservation". The increasing compassion for animals has put onerous responsibility on the zoos of ensuring a quality of life to the zoo animals that is congenial both to their physical and mental health.

Central Zoo Authority (CZA) was established in February, 1992, with the objective of overseeing the management of zoos and provide them necessary technical and financial inputs to come upto the desired level of management.

The statutory functions of the Authority under the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 are:-

- to specify the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in a zoo;
- to evaluate and assess the functioning of the zoos with respect to the prescribed standards or norms;
- to recognise or derecognise zoos;
- to identify endangered species of wild animals for purposes of captive breeding and assigning responsibility in this regard to a zoo;
- to coordinate the acquisition, exchange and loaning of animals for breeding purpose;
- to ensure maintenance of studbooks of endangered species of wild animals bred in captivity;
- to identify priorities and themes with regard to display of captive animals in zoos;

- to coordinate training of zoo personnel in India and outside India;
- to coordinate research in captive breeding and educational programmes for the purposes of zoos;
- to provide technical and other assistance to zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- to perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act with regard to zoos.

RECONSTITUTION OF THE AUTHORITY

The Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 38A and subsection (1) of Section 38B of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, has reconstituted the CZA for the fourth time, through Gazette Notification dated 2nd March, 2001.

CHAPTER-II

IMPORTANT INITIATIVES TAKEN BY THE CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY DURING THE YEAR

- 1. In spite of continued efforts of the Government of India and the CZA, most of the zoos have not shown substantial improvement over a period of time, primarily due to lack of availability of resources; both manpower and finances. The problem is further compounded by the fact that despite the resource crunch, some States have a tendency to create new zoos. Inter-alia it has been decided in consultation with the State Governments that the main focus of the State Governments would be on modernization of existing Zoos. No new Zoo will be established/licensed for next 4-5 years.
- 2. Frequent transfers of zoo personnel have hampered the growth of professionalism in zoos. To address this problem, a decision was taken in consultation with the State Governments and other zoo owners, that the veterinarians would be inducted in zoos at an early stage of their career and allowed to continue to function as zoo veterinarians as long as they wish, after giving assured time bound promotion.
- 3. Realizing the need for upgrading the diagnostic facilities and healthcare of zoo animals, and after taking into consideration the fact that the zoos do not have manpower to achieve this objective, financial assistance has been provided to identified Universities and colleges to create diagnostic facilities for wild animals.

- 4. It has been observed that the response of zoos to any epidemic/infectious diseases affecting the zoo animals is very poor. Even the required drugs are not readily available with the veterinarians. To address such contingencies, the zoos have been asked to keep essential prophylactic and curative drugs in their stock.
- 5. Although the relevant rules provide that zoo animals should be screened for parasitic and infectious diseases on regular basis, this has not been done in most cases. The CZA sent teams to 34 zoos to ensure that the Rules are implemented in letter and spirit. Hands-on expertise was also made available on site.
- 6. The Ministry of Environment and Forests had given the CZA an additional responsibility of creating housing, upkeep and healthcare facility for circus animals. The work was completed at four centres namely, Chennai, Bangalore, Vishakapatnam and Tirupathi during the year under report.

7. Realizing the need for special attention to zoos in the North East, where hardly any good zoo exists, funding on priority basis was provided to North Eastern States and an amount of Rs.318.31 lakhs was sanctioned to the following zoos during the year for this purpose.

CHAPTER - III

EVALUATION, MONITORING AND DEVELOPMENT OF ZOOS

I. EVALUATION

LARGE, MEDIUM, SMALL & MINI ZOOS:

During the year under report, 13 large zoos, 10 medium zoos, 11 small zoos and 12 mini zoos and deer parks were evaluated. The list of zoos evaluated is placed at **Annexure-I.**

During the year, one large zoo and 9 mini zoos were granted conditional recognition by the CZA. Eight mini zoos were refused recognition and recognition to 4 zoos was kept in abeyance. The list of zoos granted conditional recognition and zoos refused recognition is placed at **Annexure - II.**

II. MONITORING

With a view to monitor the status of implementation of standards and norms laid down under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992, appraisal was carried out of all large, medium and small zoos in the country. The facilities for carrying out routine blood and scat examination of animals at veterinary hospital of the zoo, schedule for screening of animals and disinfection of enclosures for maintaining proper hygienic conditions were given special attention. The areas requiring

urgent attention for improvements by the zoos were identified and the concerned State Governments have been asked to take corrective steps.

III. MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS IN THE ZOOS

CZA continued its efforts to provide assistance to zoos to improve housing and health care standards of zoo animals. Steps were taken to help zoos carry out modernization at their existing locations or facilitate their relocation to large naturalistic sites. Some of the significant improvements brought about in the zoos in country during the period under report are as follows:

- 1. Kasturba Gandhi Zoo at Surat has been relocated at a new site at Surat. 'The old zoo with dingy cages has been closed down.
- 2. Primates and tigers have been provided with spacious and naturalistic enclosures at Alipore Zoological Garden, Kolkata.
- 3. Elephants and rhinos have been provided large and naturalistic enclosures at

- Thiruvananthapuram Zoo. The veterinary hospital at zoo has also been renovated and modernized.
- 4. Large open naturalistic enclosure for tiger has also been constructed at Sri Venkateswara Zoological Park, Tirupati.
- The food storage facilities at the zoo have also been upgraded.
- 5. New naturalistic enclosures for primates, bears and panthers have been constructed at Gandhi Zoological Park, Gwalior.

CHAPTER-IV

PLANNED BREEDING OF ENDANGERED SPECIES

Because of continued technical and financial support by the CZA, there has been a qualitative improvement in the standard of housing, upkeep and health care of zoo animals. These improvements have manifested in successful breeding in many endangered species particularly snow leopard, red panda, rhinoceros, nicobar pigeon and nilgiri langur.

With a view to avoid inbreeding and facilitate planned breeding, it has been decided to implant transponders in animals of endangered species particularly those of wild origin in view of their genetic importance. For this purpose, 400 transponders have been acquired and action to get these implanted in the selected animals has been initiated.

Proper documentation of the genetics of captive bred animals holds the key for avoiding inbreeding. With this objective, Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun, was awarded a project at a cost of Rs 2.07 lakhs for compilation of studbooks for five species namely one horned rhinoceros, Indian lion, bengal tiger, lion tailed macaque and golden langur. The studbooks have now been compiled.

Exchange programme

The Technical Committee of the CZA met on 26th August 2000, and 16th December 2000 during the year. The Committee reviewed exchange proposals submitted by zoos. On the basis of the decisions taken by the Committee and under the powers delegated to the Member Secretary in this regard, proposals for exchange, loaning and gifting of zoo animals within the country and zoos abroad were approved. The list of approved proposals is placed at **Annexure - III**

CHAPTER-V

HEALTH CARE OF ZOO ANIMALS

The expertise available with the zoos in detection of various blood borne diseases infecting wild animals is inadequate, with the result that treatment of zoo animals is generally not upto the desired standards. With a view to generate awareness among zoo managers about the need for having a systematic and scientific approach towards this aspect, the CZA organised a National consultation on Blood borne diseases, diagnostics, cure and prevention between 19th - 20th July, 2000 at Chennai. 60 participants comprising of Scientists, Zoo managers, Veterinarians, foreign experts and policy makers attended the consultation. An amount of Rs 5.36 lakhs was spent by CZA for organizing this Consultation. The detailed recommendations were published in the proceedings of the Consultation, which were later circulated to all the zoos in the country and the respective State Governments, so that zoos take appropriate measures to combat the blood borne diseases. One of the major recommendations made during the Consultation was that of strengthening the existing diagnostic facilities in the Universities/veterinary colleges situated near major zoos, so that they can take up diagnosis of various diseases infecting the zoo animals. The CZA has decided to provide financial assistance to the maximum of Rs.50.00 lakhs to institutions identified in different zones of the country for strengthening their clinical and diagnostic facilities.

Accordingly the CZA provided Rs. 16.50 lakhs to Indian Veterinary Research Institute (IVRI), Izzatnagar for upgrading its existing diagnostic facilities for Wildlife Diseases.

In order to give a major thrust in the field of upgradation of basic veterinary facilities in the Indian Zoos, the CZA is providing 100% financial assistance for construction of veterinary hospitals, treatment and post-mortem rooms. Funding is also being provided to the zoos to upgrade their existing veterinary facilities with latest diagnostic equipment. During the year under report, the CZA has provided financial assistance of

Rs. 68.72 lakhs to 10 zoos for upgradation of veterinary facilities.

In order to provide technical assistance to the zoo managers and veterinarians, the CZA provided Rs 1.75 Lakhs to Indian Zoo Directors Association for publishing the third volume of compendium containing published

papers and articles on "Health & Disease Management". Financial assistance of Rs 45,000/- was also provided to the Association of Indian Zoo and Wildlife Veterinarians for bringing out a handbook on "Dietary Husbandry of Wild Mammalia". Both the books were brought out during the year under report.

CHAPTER - VI

RESEARCH & TRAINING

- 1. The Wildlife Institute of India,
 Dehradun (WII) submitted the final
 report on the project "Evaluation of
 exhibit design related behaviour
 patterns in primates and carnivores in
 selected Indian Zoos and its implication
 in species compatible design" for
 which financial grants of Rs 2 Lakhs
 was provided by Central Zoo Authority.
- 2. A two-week capsule course in Endangered Species and Zoo Management for Zoo Directors was organised at Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, Vishakapatnam from 7th to 16th February 2001 in collaboration with the WII at a cost of Rs 6.12 lakhs. It was attended by 15 participants.
- 3. Training programme for Zoo keepers was organised in Nandankanan Zoological Park, Bhubneswar (from 11th to 17th February & 4th to 10th March, 2001); Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad (from 10th to 19th February, 2001): Kanpur Zoological Park, Kanpur (from 1st February to 11 February, 2001), and Assam State Zoo, Guwahati (from 20th February to 1st March, 2001) In all 109 animal keepers were trained. CZA has provided Rs 4.00 for conducting lakhs these programmes.

- 4. Shri Y. S. Yalaki, Director, Thiruvanthapuram Zoo, Kerala and Dr. S.K. Bhowmick, Veterinary Officer, Sepahijala Zoological Park Tripura participated in a three weeks course on "Conservation of Endangered Species" at Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust, UK during July-August, 2000. The CZA provided Rs 3.49 lakhs to meet the fees, travel and stay costs of the two officers.
- organised in collaboration with School of Planning and Architecture (SPA) in New Delhi between 27th November to 2nd December 2000. Architects, landscape designers and engineers from the zoos and all over the country participated in the Workshop. The CZA provided Rs.4.55lakhs to SPA for organizing the workshop.
- organised at Vishakapatnam on 16-17
 February 2001. The main objective of the conference was to prepare an animal collection plan for each zoo as laid out in the National Zoo Policy.

CHAPTER - VII

RESCUE AND REHABILITATION

REHABILITATION OF ANIMALS FROM CIRCUSES:

The Government of India has put a ban on performance of lion, tiger, panther, bear and monkeys by circuses. Consequent to the ban, these animals were to be rehabilitated by creating appropriate facilities. As Indian zoos do not have adequate facilities to rehabilitate all these animals, the Central Government decided that rescue centers should be got

created by the CZA in the off display areas of the various zoos. Accordingly, the CZA has established five rescue Centres at the following Zoos:

- Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu
- 2. Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh
- 3. Sri Venkateswara Zoological Garden, Tirupathi, Andhra Pradesh

- 4. Bannerghatta National Park, Bangalore, Karnataka
- 5. Nahargarh Biological Park, Jaipur, Rajasthan

Out of these five locations, work at four centres namely, Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chennai in Tamil Nadu; Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, Visakhapatnam & Sri Venkateswara Zoological Garden, Tirupathi in Andhra Pradesh, and Bannerghatta National Park, Bangalore in Karnataka have been

completed. During this year an amount of Rs 41.00 lakhs and Rs 16.25 lakhs was granted to Bannerghatta zoo and Arignar Anna Zoo respectively for completing the works at rescue centers. These rescue centres have started receiving animals from the circuses. The construction work of Rescue Centre at Nahargarh Biological Park, Jaipur in Rajasthan is in progress and is expected to be ready by the end of 2001. Creation of rescue centre at two other places shall be taken up after due assessment of requirement.

The services Shri W.C. Arora, a retired IES officer were continued to be availed during the year to attend the work of Registrar in the CZA on contract basis as per the approval Central Zoo Authority in its meeting held on 21.11.1996.

The Administrative Committee of CZA in its meeting held on 16.3.2000 has approved engagement of two scientists, two data entry operators and one LDC on contract basis. It was also approved that one stenographer and one evaluation & monitoring assistant (retired personnel) may be engaged on contract basis. Accordingly the Services of Shri Bipul Chakrabarty and Shri Brij Kishore

Gupta were continued during the year to work as Scientist on contract basis. Two Data Entry Operators, one LDC and one Stenographer (a retired Government servant) were engaged on contract basis. One retired person of Civil Accounts Service was engaged on contract basis against the vacant post of Accountant during the year.

One daily wages peon who was accorded temporary status in pursuance to Deptt. of Personnel and Training Order No. 51016/2/90-Estt.(c) Dated 10.9.1993, by CZA vide its Office Order dated 19.1.1998, continued to work as daily wages peon during the year.

CHAPTER-IX

FINANCIAL MATTERS

During the year, the CZA had received Rs.1101.01 lakhs as Grants-in Aid from the Ministry of Environment and Forests. Out of this, a sum of Rs. 966.69 lakhs was released as Grant to Zoos during the year. This includes Rs. 57.25 lakhs for creation of rescue centres for rehabilitation of circus animals and Rs. 17.19 lakhs towards cost of feed and upkeep of rescued animals. A list of zoos, which received financial assistance from the CZA during 2000-2001, showing activity-wise details, is placed at **Annexure IV**

Annual Accounts & Audit

The accounts of CZA are audited by the Comptroller & Auditor General of India under

Section 19 (2) of C&AG's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 38E(5)&(6) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act 1972.

The annual accounts of the CZA for the year were submitted to the Principal Director of Audit, Scientific Department on 11.5.2001 and detailed audit was carried out from 25th June 2001 to 4th July 2001. The copies of the audited accounts for the year 2000-2001 containing Receipts & Payments Accounts, Income & Expenditure Accounts and the Balance Sheets as on 31.3.2001, with schedules, are placed at Annexure V to VII. The Audit Certificate is placed at Annexure VIII.

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR 2001-02

During the year 2001-02, grants of Rs. 993.53 lakhs was provided by CZA to the Zoos for the undertaken the activities as shown in the Annexure I. This includes Rs. 872.73 lakhs for developmental work for creating assets.

2. Upto the year 2000-01, no depreciation was charged on fixed assets. From the year 2001-02, Depreciation on fixed assets are charged as per the rates prescribed in Income Tax Rule. Depreciation of Rs. 19,94,629/- is calculated as Prior Period Adjustment as **Annexure II**. This has been charged to the original cost of assets and corresponding adjustment is made in Central Zoo Authority Fund. The Depreciation for the year 2001-02 is charged to Income and Expenditure Accounts(**Annexure II**.

- 2. In view of there being no taxable income under Income Tax Act. 1961, no provision for Income Tax has been considered necessary. While assessing the Income of CZA for FY 1997-98, the Assessing Officer has incorrectly worked out tax liability of Rs. 26 lakhs which has been contested by CZA in CIT(Appeal). Appeal was accepted by the CIT(Appeal). However, final decision of the Income Tax Deptt. is still awaited.
- The NDMC has served a notice to CZA and other offices in this complex for payment of charges of electricity and water with retrospective effect. However, actual payment due is yet to be worked out. Therefore no provision has been made for this liability during the current year.
- Expenses of Rs. 1.15.098/- shown under "Contribution Towards Superannuation Scheme" in Income and Expenditure Accounts' includes Rs. 79,068/- as prior period expenses.

## ACCOUNTING POLICY OF CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY, 2001-02

#### Introduction

Central Zoo Authority (CZA) is a statutory, autonomous organization created under Section 38A of the Wildlife (Protection) Act. 1972 under Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India w.e.f. 4.2.1991. The Principal Director of Audit, Scientific Departments, New Delhi conducts the Audit of the Accounts of CZA on annual basis on behalf of Comptroller and Auditor General of India.

#### **Accounting Convention:**

The Accounts of the CZA are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and on the accrual method of accounting.

#### Depreciation:

Depreciation on the fixed assets is provided on the written Down Value method as per the Rates specified in Appendix I under Rule 5 of the Income Tax Rules 1962 with consistency concept. In respect of addition to/ deductions from fixed assets during the year, depreciation is considered on pro-rata basis.

### Accounting Treatment of Grants Received from the Government

Central Zoo Authority is a Plan Scheme under Ministry of Environment and Forests. The entire Grants-in-aid is received from the Government as Plan Grant. The Grants in aid is utilised for incurring revenue as well as capital expenses. The unutilised Grants-in-aid at the close of the year is Refundable to the Ministry. Therefore, unutilised grants-in-aid is accordingly depicted as "Unutilised Grant Refundable to the Ministry" in the Income and Expenditure Accounts and Balance Sheet. The same is adjusted in next years grants-in-aid. Government grants-in-aid is accounted on realization basis.

#### **Retirement Benefits**

The CZA has adopted the Superannuation Pension Scheme of Life Insurance Corporation of India. Liability towards pension of the CZA Employees is discharged by making payment of the amount equivalent to the employers contribution applicable in CPF Scheme to the LIC on annual basis. In respect of Gratuity' the liability is being worked out on the basis of actuarial valuation. Provisions will be made accordingly after completing actuarial valuation.
