CHAPTER-I

THE CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY

Central Zoo Authority (CZA) was established in February, 1992, with the objective of overseeing the management of zoos and provide them necessary technical and financial inputs to come upto the desired level of management.

The statutory functions of the Authority under the Wild Life (Protection)Act, 1972 are:-

- to specify the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in a zoo;
- to evaluate and assess the functioning of the zoos with respect to the prescribed standards or norms;
- to recognise or derecognise zoos;
- to identify endangered species of wild animals for purposes of captive breeding and assigning responsibility in this regard to a zoo;
- to coordinate the acquisition, exchange and loaning of animals for breeding purpose;
- to ensure maintenance of studbooks of endangered species of wild animals bred in captivity;
- to identify priorities and themes with regard to display of captive animals in zoos;
- to coordinate training of zoo personnel in India and outside India:

- to coordinate research in captive breeding and educational programmes for the purposes of zoos;
- to provide technical and other assistance to zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- to perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act with regard to zoos.

RECONSTITUTION OF THE AUTHORITY

The Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 38A and sub-section (1) of Section 38B of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972, has reconstituted the CZA for the fourth time, through Gazette Notification No. SO 195 (E) dated 2nd March, 2001.

The recognition to zoos is granted subject to the condition that they will redress their shortcomings within a prescribed period of time. CHAPTER - II

IMPORTANT INITIATIVES TAKEN BY THE CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY DURING THE YEAR

A seized star tortoise

- 1. The Central Zoo Authority took initiative and coordinated with the CITES authorities at Singapore & their Indian counterparts in the Ministry of Environment & Forests, the Wildlife Institute of India and Andhra Pradesh Forest Department, to bring back 1830 star tortoises into the country, which were seized by the Singapore authorities. At present these tortoises have been rehabilitated at Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad. A strategy for their final rehabilitation in the wild has also been drawn up and is under implementation.
- 2. A planned breeding programme for the Lion Tailed macaques in few select zoos in the country was drawn up and is under implementation. The main aim

- of this programme is to build a viable population of the species in Indian zoos. The programme is being coordinated by the Director, Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chennai with technical inputs from Dr. Mewa Singh, Chairperson, Dept. of Psychology, University of Mysore & Dr. Ajith Kumar, Principal Scientist & Head, Division of Conservation Biology, Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural History(SACON), Coimbatore.
- 3. It is mandatory under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992 to carry out regular health checkup of the staff posted in zoos. However, due to paucity of funds, many zoos are not able to comply with this stipulation. The Central Zoo Authority therefore has decided to grant annual financial assistance upto

a maximum of Rs. 10,000/- to needy large & medium category zoos and Rs. 5000/- to small zoos for carrying out regular health checkup of the staff.

- 4. To provide specialized diagnostic facility for proper diagnosis of diseases affecting the zoo animals, financial assistance was approved to two veterinary institutions, namely, Madras Veterinary College, Chennai and Assam Veterinary College, Guwahati. These institutions will extend support in investigation and monitoring of wild animal diseases to the zoos located in their respective zones.
 - 5. During the year an ex-gratia compensation of Rs. 10.20 lakhs was provided to seven mobile zoo owners of Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan. These mobile zoo owners had earlier surrendered their animals as per the directive of the Hon'ble High Court,

Delhi and were facing hardship due to loss of livelihood.

- 6. With a view to modernize the zoos in the country; the Central Zoo Authority took initiative in finalizing of the master layout plans of Kamla Nehru Prani Sangrahalaya (Indore Zoo) in Madhya Pradesh & Aizwal Zoo in Mizoram. The Indore zoo is being made de novo at its existing site, whereas the Aizwal zoo is being developed at a new site.
 - 7. To bring greater transparency in management of zoos and to facilitate exchange of animals for making viable social group, inventory of animals giving details of birth and death, species-wise, was published and distributed among zoo managers, animals welfare organizations, research institutions and other concerned organizations.



CHAPTER - III

EVALUATION MONITORING AND DEVELOPMENT OF ZOOS

I. EVALUATION LARGE, MEDIUM, SMALL & MINI ZOOS:

Four large, 6 medium, 2 small and 13 mini zoos were got evaluated during the year. The list of zoos evaluated is placed at **Annexure-I.** The number of zoos granted recognition and zoos refused recognition during the year is given at **Annexure-II**

II. MONITORING

With a view to monitor the status of implementation of standards and norms laid down under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992, the Central Zoo Authority kept on pursuing the State Govt. to close down badly managed zoos in the country.

During the end of the year, there were 164 recognised zoos in the country. It has been decided to review the cases of 91 zoos, which were earlier refused recognition but have not since been closed, for re-recognition. Total zoos, which stood closed were 91. The detailed list of recognised zoos, zoos not granted recognition and zoos which have closed their operation at the end of the year 2002-2003 is at **Annexure-III**

III. IMPROVEMENTS IN THE ZOOS

During the year the Design Committee met on 19th June, 2002, 3rd September, 2002 and 17th January, 2003. The Committee reviewed the designs of animal enclosures and layout plans submitted by different zoos. During this period, besides approving

designs of various animal enclosures to be constructed in zoos, the Committee also approved layout plans of Kamla Nehru Prani Sangrahalaya, Indore and Aizwal Zoo at the new site at Sairang.

CZA continued its efforts to provide assistance to zoos for improving the existing housing facilities as well as for construction of new enclosures for zoo animals. An amount of Rs.578 lakhs was released during the year under report, as financial assistance to zoos for improvement and construction of new & naturalistic animal enclosures.

CHAPTER -IV

PLANNED BREEDING OF ENDANGERED SPECIES

With continued technical and financial support by the CZA, there has been a qualitative improvement in the standard of housing, upkeep and health care of zoo animals. These improvements have manifested in successful breeding in endangered species particularly Hornbill, Bhutan grey peacock pheasant, nicobar pigeon, four horned antelope, binturong, leopard cat, sangai, swamp deer, gaur, nilgiri langur, snow leopard, one horned rhino, wolf, chameleon, monitor lizard, python and russel's viper.

With a view to initiate planned breeding of endangered pheasants in the country, the Central Zoo Authority in association with the World Pheasant Association has initiated a programme for application of closed rings in pheasants. This year also rings were applied in Bhutan grey peacock pheasant at Alipore zoo and Red Jungle fowl in National Zoological Park, Delhi and Kufri, Shimla. Only the chicks are being applied closed rings. The zoos have been asked to maintain records relating to the parentage, sex etc. with respect to each of the marked pheasants.

Proper documentation of the genetics of captive bred animals holds the key for avoiding inbreeding. With this objective, Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun, was awarded a project for compilation of studbooks for five species namely one horned

rhinoceros, Indian lion, Bengal tiger, lion tailed macaque and golden langur. The studbooks were complied and circulated to the Zoos displaying the animals. The Studbooks were also sent to respective International Studbook Keepers, so that the data from India could be incorporated in the international database. WII has been again awarded the work for maintaining the studbooks for the year 2001-2002.

During the year, the Technical Committee of the CZA met on 21st June,

2002, 5th September, 2002 and 27th November, 2002. The Committee reviewed exchange proposals submitted by zoos. On the basis of the decisions taken by the Committee and under the powers delegated to the Member Secretary in this regard, proposals for exchange, loaning and gifting of zoo animals within the country and zoos abroad were approved. The list of approved proposals is placed at Annexure -IV. List of birth of animals of important endangered species which occurred during the year under report is at Annexure-V.

CHAPTER-V HEALTH CARE OF ZOO ANIMALS


The expertise available with the zoos in management of the captive wild animals is inadequate, with the result that there is high rate of mortality among the zoo animals. With a view to generate awareness among zoo veterinarians about the need for having a systematic and scientific approach towards this aspect, the Association of Indian Zoo and Wildlife Veterinarians organised a "National Workshop on Management of Rare and Endangered Wild Animals thei Neonatal Care", at and Thiruvananthapuram- between 25th-27th April 2002. An amount of Rs.4.27 lakhs was given as grant to the organization for conducting the workshop.

As part of the ongoing project on strengthening of diagnostic facilities in identified veterinary universities/colleges, the Authority during the year released Rs.10.0 lakhs to Sher -E - Kashmir University of Agriculture and Technology, Jammu; Rs.16.15 lakhs to

Orissa University of Agriculture and Technology, Bhubneswar; Rs.42.68 lakhs to Tamil Nadu University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Chennai and Rs.22.45 lakhs to Assam Agriculture University, Jorhat.

In order to provide technical assistance to the zoo managers and veterinarians, the CZA decided to bring out a manual on "Basic post mortem requisites for zoo veterinarians written by Dr. Mathew C. John & et.al and a handbook on the "Protocol & Postmortem Procedure for Elephant" written by Dr. Jacob V Cheeran.

The CZA during the year under report provided Rs.67.71lakhs to the Indian zoos for upgrading the veterinary and health care facilities. New hospitals and treatment rooms were commissioned at Rajiv Gandhi Zoological Park, Pune in Maharashtra; Assam State Zoo, Guwahati in Assam and Aizwal Zoo, Sairang in Mizoram.

CHAPTER - VI

RESEARCH & TRAINING

(A) Establishment of Laboratory for Conservation of Endangered Species (LaCONES):

In order to make use of biotechnological intervention for the conservation of endangered animals (lions, tigers etc.), it was decided in 1998 to undertake the Project of Laboratory for Conservation of Endangered Species (LaCONES) with the collaboration of three parties, e.g. the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Central Zoo Authority (CZA) and the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The genesis of establishment of LaCONES, however, goes back to 1993 when certain attempts were made to take out the genetic material out of the country which were stalled by Ministry of Environment & Forests. It was at this stage that the Ministry of Environment & Forests carried out an exercise to locate a suitable institute to undertake DNA characterization and cryopreservation of the samples. Centre for Cellular & Molecular Biology (CCMB), Hyderabad, a centre of excellence under the (CSIR) Council of Scientific & Industrial Reserach, was identified by the Ministry for carrying out this work.

The initial cost of the LaCONES Project was proposed at Rs. 4.46 crores, out of which Rs. 2.00 crores was

provided by the CZA. The balance amount was provided by the DBT.

The foundation stone of the facility was laid by Minister for Environment & Forests, who is also Chairman of the CZA, on 16.9.2001. It became apparent by this time that the funds allocated by the CZA and DBT were not adequate to create the essential functional facility for the work of this nature and magnitude. CZA agreed to provide a further sum of Rs. 3.60 crores for construction of Phase-L of the facility provided the recurring expenditure were financed by DBT and Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR). CSIR has since agreed to provide permanent positions. utilities and maintenance of LaCONES. Authority has made a provision of Rs. 1.80 crores in its budget for 2003-04 for this purpose.

The objectives of setting up the Project are as under:

 Monitoring of Genetic variation by modern techniques such as DNA fingerprinting:

In order to understand distribution of genetic variation among populations and the relationship among individuals within the population. Further, these techniques can be used in the area of wildlife forensic.

2. Establishment of cell/gene resource bank:

By developing methods for cryopreservation of cells and semen, eggs and embryos of endangered species. These cells preserved under appropriate conditions could be used in the future for various purposes including cloning.

3. Semen analylsis:

In order to study the seminal profile for selecting animals for breeding programme.

4. Determination of ovulation:

To achieve success in artificial insemination as well as captive breeding.

5. Artificial insemination (AI):
Although well established in case of domestic animals, this technique needs to be standardized for use in wild animals.

The main thrust will be on nonsurgical Al which is ideal for zoo conditions. Other options will be intrauterine insemination flowing laparoscopy/ laparotomy.

6. In vitro fertilization (IVF) and embryo transfer:

Involves fusion of spermatozoon with oocyte carried out *in vitro* and the transfer of the resulting embryo to the true or surrogate mother, or its cryo-preservation for future.

7. Cloning:

This technology would be developed only for those species, which are highly endangered or in case of an already extinct animal like the Cheetah.


(B) Wildlife Institute of India (WII) was granted financial assistance of Rs.30,000-/ for carrying out a research project on "Density related behaviour of select Ungulates in four zoos of Southern India". The research project is part of the M.Sc. dissertation course conducted by the Wildlife Institute of India.

TRAINING

- 1. A two-week capsule course in Endangered Species and Zoo Management for Zoo managers was organised at Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chhenai and Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad during February 2003 in collaboration with the WII at a cost of Rs. 7.00 lakhs. 25 participants attended it.
- 2. Training programme for Zookeepers was organised at Kanpur Zoological Park, Kanpur (from 1.2.2003 to 11.2.2003); Kamla Nehru Zoological Park, Ahmedabad (from 20.9.2002 to 29.9.2002) and Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chennai (from

10.12.2002 to 14.12.2002). In all 93 animal keepers were trained. Two keepers from King Mahendra Trust for Nature Conservation, Nepal also participated in the training programme at Kanpur Zoo.

3. Dr. N.Manoharan Director, V.O.C Park Zoo, Coimbatore and Dr. Utkarsh Shukla, Veterinary Officer, Lucknow zoo participated in a three weeks course on "Conservation of Endangered Species and Zoos" at Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust, UK during July-August, 2002 The CZA provided Rs.2.29 lakhs to meet the expenditure on fees, travel and stay costs of the two officers.

CHAPTER - VII

RESCUE AND REHABILITATION

REHABILITATION OF ANIMALS FROM CIRCUSES:

The Government of India has put a ban on performance of lion, tiger, panther, bear and monkeys by circuses. Consequent to the ban, these animals were to be rehabilitated by creating appropriate facilities. As Indian zoos do not have adequate facilities to rehabilitate all these animals, the Central Government decided that rescue centers should be got created by the CZA in off the display areas of the various zoos. Accordingly, the CZA has established five rescue Centres at the following Zoos:

- Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- 2. Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh
- Sri Venkateswara Zoological Garden, Tirupathi, Andhra Pradesh
- 4. Bannerghatta National Park, Bangalore, Karnataka
- Nahargarh Biological Park, Jaipur, Rajasthan

These Centres, which have been made functional, received a total of 192 lions and 40 tigers from various circuses.

During the year an amount of Rs 56.31 lakhs was released to Bannerghatta Zoo, Rs. 29.90 lakhs to Sri Venkateshwara Zoological Park, Rs.40.16 lakhs to Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, & Rs.8.80lakhs to Nahargarh, Jaipur for maintenance and upkeep of animals these Rescue Centers.

REHABILITATION OF ANIMALS FROM CLOSED ZOOS

An amount of Rs.3 lakhs was also released to Kanpur Zoo for meeting the feeding & upkeep cost of the rescued animals from closed mobile zoos.

The services Shri W.C. Arora, a retired IES officer were continued to be availed during the year to attend the work of Registrar in the CZA on contract basis as per the approval given by CZA in its meeting held on 21.11.1996.

The Administrative Committee approved engagement of two scientists, two data entry operators and one LDC on contract basis for assisting the Member Secretary in carrying out the functions of the Authority. Accordingly, the services of Shri Bipul Chakrabarty were continued to be availed during the year to work as

Scientist on contract basis. Two Data Entry Operators & one LDC were engaged on contract basis. One retired person of Civil Accounts Service was engaged on contract basis against the vacant post of Accountant during the year.

One daily wages peon who was accorded temporary status in pursuance to Deptt. of Personnel and Training Order No. 51016/2/90-Estt. (c) Dated 10.9.1993, by CZA vide its Office Order dated 19.1.1998, continued to work as daily wages peon during the year.

CHAPTER-IX

FINANCIAL MATTERS

During the year, the CZA had received Rs.1225.20 lakhs as Grants-in Aid from the Ministry of Environment and Forests. Out of this, a sum of Rs. 1066.60 lakhs was released as Grant to Zoos during the year. This included Rs. 148.37lakhs for rehabilitation, feed and upkeep of rescued animals from circuses. A list of zoos, which received financial assistance from the CZA during 2002-2003, showing activity-wise details, is placed at **Annexure-VI**.


Annual Accounts & Audit

The accounts of CZA are audited by the Comptroller & Auditor General



Audit Report on the Accounts of Central Zoo Authority New Delhi for the year 2002-03

Introduction

The Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi was established in February, 1992 under Section 38A of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The Authority started functioning from 4th February, 1992. It is totally financed by grants and loans received from the Central Government. During the year 2001-2002, the Authority received grants amonting to Rs. 1080.00 lakhs from the Ministry of Environment and Forests, New Delhi.

The Accounts of the Authority are audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with section 38 (G) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 as amended.

Comments on Accounts:

1. Non Capitalization of Assets.

As per condition (iv) of the sanction letter issued by the Ministry of Environment and Forests, and condition (h) of Memorandum of Understanding, the Authority was required to furnish annually an extract of various assets created out of grant. It was, however, noticed that no such extract/statement of assets as mentioned above in respect of grants released to various zoos amounting to Rs. 1066.60 lakh during 2002-2003 by the Authority was appended with the annual accounts. In the absence of the Statement of Assets, the whole amount of grant to zoos amounting to Rs. 1066.60 lakh was depicted as revenue expenditure, which is incorrect. This was persistently pointed out in the earlier Audit Reports, but no progress in this regard has been made so far.

The Authority stated (November 2003) that the requisite extract / statement of assets created during 2002-03 was appended to the annual accounts of Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi and out of grants of Rs. 1066.60 lakh released to various zoos, the grant of Rs. 1066.60 lakhs was towards revenue expenditure. The reply is not tenable as the extract/statement attached to the annual A/cs is simply a detail of grant released to various zoos during 2002-03 and not specific about the kind of assets as to have been created out of the grant of Rs. 1066.60 lakhs.

2. Non receipt of utilization certificates amounting to Rs. 758.49 lakh.

The authority releases grants in aid to various zoos. It was observed that Utilization Certificates for Rs. 758.49 lakh were still awaited in respect of 35 zoos since 1997-98 as pedetails given below:-

3. Release of Rs. 22.45 lakh without receipt of Memorandum of Understanding

The authority released lst instalment of Rs. 22.45 lakh on 18.3.2003 to Assam Agricultural University, Jorhat (Assam) for establishment of 'Modern diagnostic facilities and tools for investigations and diagnosis of Wildlife diseases'. The funds were released on the basis photo copy of Memorandum of Understanding instead of Original Memorandum of Understanding.

The Authority stated (Novembeer, 2003) that signing of MOU is a lengthy process. Therefore, in order to start the work immediately, Central Zoo Authority has adopted the policy to release 50% of the funds immediately but only after stipulating the condition of MOU. The reply of CZA is not acceptable as the funds were released before the receipt of MOU.

4. Physical Verification

Physical Verification of assets of the Authority for the year 2002-03 had not been conducted in the absence of which the correctness of the value of assets of Rs. 12.38 lakh addepicted in the Balance Sheet could not be verified in audit.

5. Revision of Annual Accounts

During audit of accounts some discrepancies of misclassification were pointed out in all the three accounts i.e. Receipt and Payment Account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet and Consequently the accounts were revised at the instance of Audit. Revision of accounts has resulted into increase of Rs. 2.67 lakh on the both the sides of receipt and payment accounts and increase of Rs. 1.00 lakh in the expenditure of income and expenditure accounts.

The revised schedules of Annual Accounts have been appended by CZA to the Annual Accounts.
