# **CENTRAL ZOO AUTHORITY**

Statutory Body of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change Government of India



The Central Zoo Authority (CZA) is a statutory body under the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India. It was constituted under the provisions of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 was amended through an amendment Act in the year 1991. A separate chapter, Chapter IVA contains Section 38 A to 38 J was added to the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 for establishment of Central Zoo Authority in India. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority was established as a statutory body under the Ministry of Environment & Forests by the Government of India in the year 1992. The prime concern of the CZA has been to raise the existing standards of animal housing, upkeep and health care in the zoos of the country. The Central Zoo Authority oversees the functioning of zoos in India and provides them technical assistance.

The Government of India formulated the National Zoo Policy, 1998 to set the goals and objectives for the management of zoos in the country so that the national efforts in wildlife conservation are supplemented with the *ex-situ* conservation of wildlife. The standards and norms for housing, upkeep, health care of captive animals and overall management of zoos have been laid down under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009. Every zoo in the country is required to obtain recognition from the Authority under Section 38H of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 for its operation. The Authority periodically evaluates zoos with reference to the parameters prescribed under the Rules and grants recognition accordingly.

The Authority consists of a Chairperson, ten members and a Member Secretary. The CZA has constituted different committees for its assistance in the performance of functions assigned to it under the Section 38C of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The Administrative Committee, the Technical Committee and the Expert Group on Zoo Designing are regular constituents of the CZA. The functions of these committees are regulated by the Governing Body i.e. Central Zoo Authority, which is chaired by the Hon'ble Minister of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India and assisted by the Member Secretary as Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

Besides the primary function of recognition and release of financial assistance, the Central Zoo Authority also regulates the exchange of animals under section 38(I) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 amongst zoos in the endangered category listed under Schedule-I & II of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. The exchange of animals between Indian zoos and foreign zoos is also approved by the Authority subject to requisite clearances under EXIM Policy and the CITES permits issued by the competent authority. The Authority also coordinates and implements initiatives on capacity building of zoo personnel, planned breeding programmes and ex-situ research including biotechnological intervention for conservation of species that complement in-situ conservation efforts across the country.

During the reporting period, the Central Zoo Authority has organized "Capacity Building of Indian Zoo Veterinarians" under the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Smithsonian National Zoological Park, Washington D.C., USA at New Delhi in the field of veterinary health care of the animals. Further, the animal inventory of the member zoos of the country has been updated on 100% basis in the ZIMS software of Species360.

The publication of annual report is a mandatory requirement and a formal practice of the CZA. The annual report provides a glimpse of the activities carried out by the authority during the financial year. It is placed before the Hon'ble Members of Parliament for perusal and providing their guidance to the CZA. It is also circulated to the zoos and placed in the public domain for the benefit of the general public.

The Annual Report and the Annual Audited Account for the financial year 2017-18 as approved by the CZA on the recommendations of the Administrative Committee and the Technical Committee of the CZA has been prepared and is placed. I gratefully acknowledge the guidance of the governing body of the CZA and expert members of the various committees of the CZA. I also acknowledge the commitment, contribution and help from each and every personnel working in the CZA in the preparation of the Annual Report.

#### 1. Introduction

The Indian Board for Wildlife re-constituted its Zoo Wing as 'the Expert Group on Zoos' at its 9<sup>th</sup> session held on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 1972 at New Delhi to make detailed study for setting up and maintenance of zoos in the country. The Expert Group on Zoos submitted its report in June, 1973 which was accepted by the Board in its meeting in November, 1973. The report recommended setting up of a central agency (Zoo Grants Commission), and to give effect to this recommendation, the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 was amended through an amendment Act in the year 1991. A separate chapter, Chapter IVA contains Section 38 A to 38 J was added to the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 for establishment of Central Zoo Authority in India. Accordingly, the Central Zoo Authority was established as a statutory body under the Ministry of Environment & Forests by the Government of India in the year 1992.

#### 1.1 Vision

The zoo will have healthy animals in eco-system based naturalistic enclosure, be supportive to in-situ conservation with competent and content staff, good educational and interpretative facilities, have the support of people and be self-sufficient.

#### 1.2 Mission

The Central Zoo Authority's mission is to provide better upkeep and veterinary care to the wild animals housed in zoos in India to ensure their conservation through best practices of management and bringing education & awareness among the people.

#### 1.3 Objective

The main objective is to

- a. Enforce minimum standards and norms for upkeep and healthcare of animals in Indian zoos and
- b. Control mushrooming of unplanned and ill-conceived zoos.

#### 1.4 Functions

Zoos in India are regulated under the provisions of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and are guided by the National Zoo Policy, 1998. The Government of India formulated Recognition of Zoo Rules, 1992. It was revised as Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 on the recommendation of the Central Zoo Authority. These rules lay down standards and norms for management of zoos in the country. The Central Zoo Authority oversees the functioning of zoos in the country and provides them technical and other assistance for their improvement.

The Authority has been assigned following functions under Section 38 (C) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972:

- (a) To specify the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in zoos;
- (b) To evaluate and assess the functioning of the zoos with respect to the prescribed standards or norms;
- (c) To recognize or derecognize zoos;
- (d) To identify endangered species of wild animals for purposes of captive breeding and assigning responsibility in this regard to a zoo;
- (e) To coordinate the acquisition, exchange and loaning of animals for breeding purpose;
- (f) To ensure maintenance of studbooks of endangered species of wild animals bred in captivity;
- (g) To identify priorities and themes with regard to display of captive animals in zoos;
- (h) To coordinate training of zoo personnel in India and outside India;
- To coordinate research in captive breeding and educational programmes for the purposes of zoos;
- (j) To provide technical and other assistance to zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- (k) To perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act with regard to zoos.

#### 2.0 Governance

The CZA establishment comprises of 19 scientific and administrative personnel to assist the Member Secretary in discharge of his duties. They have been appointed/ engaged on regular/ contractual basis.

#### 2.1 Governing Body

Under Section 38-A of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 the Central Zoo Authority shall consist of a chairperson, such number of members not exceeding ten and member-secretary to be appointed by the Central Government. As per the Section 38-B of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 the chairperson and every member [other than the member-secretary] shall hold office for such period, not exceeding three years, as may be specified by the Central Government in this behalf.

Accordingly, the Governing Body of the Central Zoo Authority comprises of twelve members with the Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India as its *ex-officio* Chairperson. The Authority was reconstituted for the 8<sup>th</sup> time in May, 2014 for a period of three years vide Gazette Notification No. 1152 dated 28<sup>th</sup> May, 2014 and appointed the following members, with the Member Secretary as the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority:

# The main functions of the Technical Committee are:

a. To make recommendations regarding specifying the minimum standards for housing, upkeep and veterinary care of the animals kept in a Zoo;

- b. To approve the grant of recognition or de-recognition to the Zoos and to make recommendations for the applications received for the creation of new Zoos;
- c. Identify endangered species of wild animals for purpose of captive breeding and assigning responsibility in this regard to a Zoo;
- d. To make recommendations regarding exchange of animals with, accepting gift of animals from foreign Zoos and to gift animals to foreign Zoos;
- e. To approve exchange of animals which are part of coordinated conservation breeding programme among Indian Zoos;
- f. Identify priorities, themes and approval of Master Plan with regard to display of captive animals in a Zoo;
- g. To approve proposals for organizing training programmes, workshops and meeting in India on various aspects of Zoo management;
- h. To approve research projects on issues related with the Zoos for funding by the Authority;
- i. Provide technical assistance to Zoos for their proper management and development on scientific lines;
- j. To approve proposals for release of financial assistance to various Zoos and other organizations; and
- k. Any other function that may be assigned to it by the Central Zoo Authority.

The term of the Technical Committee is also coterminous with the term of the Central Zoo Authority which was constituted on May 28, 2014 for a period of three years. Accordingly, after the reconstitution of the Central Zoo Authority for a period of three years vide Gazette Notification No. 1492 dated 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2017, the Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority was reconstituted with the approval of the Hon'ble Minister, Environment, Forest & Climate Change, and Chairperson, Central Zoo Authority vide order No. 7-4/2017-CZA/1191/2017 dated 30.06.2017 to deal with the technical matters with following composition and same terms of reference:

- a. To scrutinise, suggest improvements, changes and make recommendations (to the Technical Committee) in the proposed Master (Layout) Plan & Master Plan submitted by various zoos.
- b. To scrutinise, suggest improvements/ changes and approve/ disapprove the designs of animal enclosures submitted by various zoos.

#### c. To suggest standards and norms for designing of animal enclosures for various zoos.

During the year 2017-18, the Expert Group on zoo designing held its meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 (73<sup>rd</sup> Meeting), 13<sup>th</sup> &14<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 (74<sup>th</sup> Meeting), 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2017 (75<sup>th</sup> Meeting), 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 (76<sup>st</sup> Meeting) and 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2018 (77<sup>th</sup> Meeting) to approve the drawings of the enclosures of the endangered species to be constructed in Indian zoos and to recommend the approval of Master (Layout) Plan and Master Plan of the zoos.

## 3.0 Appointments made in the Secretariat of the Central Zoo Authority

The Central Zoo Authority appointed Sh. Diganta Gogoi, IFS as Deputy Inspector General of Forests for Regional Office, Guwahati during the reporting period to strengthen human resource in the Central Zoo Authority. However, Sh. Diganta Gogoi was repatriated from the Central Zoo Authority w.e.f. 07.11.2017 (afternoon) at his own request.

#### 4.3 Establishment of new zoos

- 1. The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has recommended the DPR of the proposed Establishment of the Chidiyatol Zoo and Rescue Centre at Kharbai, District Raisen, Madhya Pradesh for approval of the Central Zoo Authority subject to certain conditions. One of them is that the proposed facility is in the forest area and as such, clearance under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 should be first of all obtained by the zoo authorities.
- 2. The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has recommended the DPR of the proposed establishment of the Sagar Zoo and Rescue Centre in District Sagar, Madhya Pradesh for approval of the Central Zoo Authority subject to certain conditions. The proposed facility is in the forest area. As such, clearance under Forest(Conservation) Act, 1980 should be first of all obtained by the zoo authorities.
- 3. The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has recommended the proposed establishment of the Shahid Asfaq Ullah Khan Zoological Park, Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh for approval of the Central Zoo Authority subject to certain conditions.
- 4. The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority has recommended the proposed establishment of the Mini Zoo at Holi, Himachal Pradesh for approval of the Central Zoo Authority subject to certain conditions.
- 5. The Technical Committee of the Central Zoo Authority decided to seek Action Taken Report from the Chief Wildlife Warden, Uttar Pradesh on the CZA's even letter dated 18.08.2017. The Committee opined that the Chief Wildlife Warden, Uttar Pradesh and the Member Secretary, CZA may take appropriate action as per rule on complaints on illegal operation of the Elephant Conservation & Care Centre, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh.

# 4.8 List of the recognized zoos as on 31st March 2018

The zoos in India require recognition of the Central Zoo Authority for operation under the provisions of the Section 38 H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. No zoo in the country can be established without prior permission and can be operated without recognition from the Central Zoo Authority.

For the purpose of scientific management and operation of zoos in the country and regulation of the physical and human infrastructure in the zoos, the Government of India has laid down standard and norms under the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009. Accordingly, under Rule 9 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 the zoos in India have been classified in the categories such as "Large, Medium, Small and Mini zoos". This classification of the zoos has been made for the purpose of management of the zoos and to apply the standards and norms pertaining to the housing, upkeep, veterinary care etc. The Rule 9 of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009 lays down the criteria (area of the zoo, number of visitors, number of species and animals and number of animals of endangered species) for classification of the zoos. The zoo should meet at least any four of the aforesaid criteria (including total number of species, total number of endangered species and also total number of animals including that of endangered species housed by them) to be classified into any of the above mentioned four categories.

As on 31.03.2018, there are 160 zoos in the country recognized under the Section 38 H(1) of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. The classification of these zoos are 17 Large category zoos, 25 Medium category zoos, 35 Small category zoos and 83 Mini category zoos which includes 16 Rescue Centre also.



### 4.9.3 Proposals for transfer of animals from/ or to Indian zoos

The Central Zoo Authority, other than above animal exchange proposals, has also approved the following proposal for transfer of animals from/ or to Indian zoos:

- 1. The Nawab Wajid Ali Shah Zoological Garden, Lucknow has been permitted to release 45 Male: 55 Female of Spotted deer and 3 Male: 13 Female of Hog deer to various forest areas in Uttar Pradesh.
- 2. The over-crowded and excess 2 Male : 8 Female Leopards from the Tiger & Lion Safari, Thyavarekoppa, Shivamogga has been permitted to be shifted to the Rescue Centre at Mysuru and Bengaluru.
- 3. The permission has been granted to house and display rescued Leopards (1 Male : 1 Female) in the Dhauladhar Nature Park, Gopalpur, Himachal Pradesh.
- 4. The permission has been granted to release Blackbucks (10 Male : 40 Female) from the Nandanvan Zoo & Safari, Raipur, Chhattisgarh to the Barnawapara Wildlife Sanctuary, Chhattisgarh.
- The permission has been granted to release 30 Blackbucks from the Kanan Pendari Zoological Garden, Bilaspur, Chattisgarh to the Barnawapara Wildlife Sanctuary, Chhattisgarh.
- 6. The permission has been granted to release 50 Spotted deer (22 Male : 02 Female : 26 Unsexed) from the Kanan Pendari Zoological Garden, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh to the Achanakmar Tiger Reserve, Gurughasidas National Park and the Tamor Pingla Wildlife Sanctuary in the State of Chhattisgarh.

- 7. The National Zoological Park, New Delhi has been granted permission for soft-release of the surplus population of prolifically breeding species which are Spotted deer (Axis axis) [20 Male: 30 Female], Blackbucks (Antelope cervicapra) [33 Male: 15 Female: 12 Unsexed], Sambar (*Rucervus unicolor*) [10 Male: 30 Female] and Nilgai (*Boselaphus tragocamelus*) [1 Male: 2 Female] in the Protected Areas of the neighbouring states.
- 8. The NOC has been granted to the proposal from the Chief Wildlife Warden, Bihar to re-introduce captive bred One-horned Rhinoceros (*Rhinoceros unicornis*) from the Sanjay Gandhi Biological Park, Patna to the Valmiki Tiger Reserve subject to the approval of the National Tiger Conservation Authority and other statutory authorities.
- 9. The permission was granted to shift 106 Spotted deer from the Bio-Diversity Park, President's Garden, Rashtrapati Bhawan, New Delhi to the Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserve, Kota, Rajasthan.

### 4.10 Improved Planning Process of Zoos

As per the provisions under Rule 10.3 (1) of the Recognition of Zoo Rules, 2009, the recognized zoos in the country has to prepare a Master Plan of the zoo for its long term development and it should be got approved from the Central Zoo Authority. This Master Plan is prepared for a period of twenty years and it may be revised after ten years as per the necessity. This provision has been made for planned development of the zoo on scientific lines. The Central Zoo Authority has provided financial assistance to the zoos for the preparation of their Master Plans. As such, the recognized zoos in the country prepare their Master Plans for long term development and get it approved by the Central Zoo Authority.

### 4.11 Others

## 4.11.1 Re-development & Shifting of the CZA's Website

The Central Zoo Authority website is being hosted on National Informatics Centre (NIC) shared hosting server. The website needs to be shifted to Government of India Cloud environment called "Meghraj" from shared hosting environment due to cyber-attack concerns.

The Central Zoo Authority has initiated the process of re-development of its new website through the National Informatics Centre, New Delhi, Government of India.

### 4.11.2 Utilization Certificates

There were large numbers of pending utilisation certificates with zoos for the grants released by the CZA from year 2004-2005 to 2014-2015. It was observed that UCs for an amount of Rs. 20,20.02 lakhs are pending with 53 zoos/ institutions. The office of the CZA initiated efforts to examine each case of the pending UCs and reconcile with the grantee zoos. As a result, out of 53 pending UCs, all but four has been settled. The CZA has been able to recover an amount of Rs. 1.95 Crores (Rs. 93,30,437 during financial year 2016-17 and Rs. 1,02,25,195 during financial year 2017-18) from them. This amount was not utilised by the zoo/ institution.

### 5.0 Maintenance of Studbooks

The Central Zoo Authority has granted a project titled "Development and Maintenance of Studbooks for Selected Endangered Species in Indian Zoos" to the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun. Under the project the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun has been assigned the work of preparation, updation and maintenance of National Studbooks/ Herd books of the identified endangered wild animal species listed in Schedule I and II of Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 housed in Indian zoos.

The Central Zoo Authority and the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun have signed MoU on 27.03.2012 for preparation, updation and maintenance of National Studbooks/ Herd-books of identified endangered species of captive animals housed in Indian Zoos. Under the MoU, the WII shall execute the work of updation and maintenance of existing Studbooks of 14 species which include Royal Bengal Tiger, Asiatic lion, Lion tailed macaque, One-horned rhinoceros, Hoolock gibbon, Wild ass, Gaur, Tibetan wolf, Nilgiri langur, Wild dog, Red panda, Snow leopard, Clouded leopard and Grey Peacock Pheasant.


In addition, the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun shall prepare, update and maintain National Studbooks/ Herd-books of 20 endangered wild animal species in captivity such as Chinkara, Grey wolf, Golden langur, Indian pangolin, White backed vulture, Long billed vultures, Slender billed vulture, Nicobar pigeon, Pig tailed macaque, Serow, Spectacle langur, Swamp deer, Cheer pheasant, Himalayan monal, Western tragopan, Chousinga, Mouse deer, Stump-tailed macaque, Sangai and Blue sheep.




The Central Zoo Authority conducted a review meeting of the aforesaid project during previous year held on 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2016. It was observed that the progress towards achieving the objectives of the project was very slow and not satisfactory. It was decided that the Wildlife Institute of India should speed up the preparation and updation of Studbook for all the species on priority basis and all the studbooks shall be submitted to the Central Zoo Authority so that they may be uploaded on the website of CZA. To assess the progress made after the said review meeting by the research team, Stud book Project, Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun again a meeting was held on 19.03.2018 at the office of the Central Zoo Authority with the Principal Investigator, Studbook Project & his team. It is evident from the table below that a tremendous achievement has been made and all the Studbooks of 34 species has been updated and prepared once. A comparative statement of the work done in between the period after review meeting on 20.07.2016 upto 19.03.2018 is indicated below:

Further, it was decided that the studbook of all 34 species shall be updated as per the Animal Inventory of captive animals of the zoos in the country with the Central Zoo Authority for the year 2017-18 on priority basis. The Wildlife Institute of India shall submit all the updated studbook of 34 identified species by the end of the project duration which is June 2018.

### 6.0 Conservation Breeding Programme

The Central Zoo Authority has identified 73 endangered wild animal species for planned Conservation Breeding. The Conservation Breeding Programme has been launched for the 23 species in the identified zoo who has been designated as Co-ordinating/ Participating zoos for the concerned endangered species. Target is to have at least 100 properly bred and genetically, physically and behaviorally healthy individuals of each targeted species in captivity in India for proper display and as insurance for future exigencies & ultimately release back to wild.

## 6.1 Financial Assistance to the Conservation Breeding Centres

The Central Zoo Authority has provided the financial assistance for carrying forward the Conservation Breeding Programme of various species at identified zoos. During the financial year 2017-18, the CZA has approved the financial assistance for carrying forward the conservation breeding programme for Blyth's tragopan at Kohima; Vultures & Mouse deer at Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad and Clouded leopard, Binturong, Phyre's leaf monkey and Pig tailed Macaque at Sepahijala Zoological Park, Agartala and Hoolock gibbon at Biological Park, Itanagar.

The Vulture, Mouse deer, Cheer pheasant and red panda etc. are species breeding well in the captivity. The captive bred Red panda was released back in the wild in the past. The Vulture has been soft released in June, 2016 and few birds are going to be released back in the wild soon after radio tagging the birds. Similarly, a few numbers of Mouse deer has been restocked in the Amrabad Tiger Reserve, Telangana and are being monitored. The soft release plan has been almost finalized and the species is ready to be released in the wild in near future.

### 7.2 Zoological Information Management System (ZIMS)

It is mandatory under Rule 10 (42) of the Recognition of the Zoo Rules, 1992 that the every Zoo should keep a record of the birth, acquisitions, disposals (death/ transfer/ exchange) of the wild animals and birds listed in the various Schedules of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and submit the same to the Central Zoo Authority by 30<sup>th</sup> April of the every year.

Keeping above in view and to raise the standard of record keeping in Indian zoos to international standards, the Central Zoo Authority explored the possibility of joining the Species 360 {(erstwhile International Species Information System (ISIS)} during the year 2007. The Central Zoo Authority approached Species 360 for details. It was planned to initiate the ZIMS software in the selected zoos in the country, first by subscribing services of Species 360 by the Central Zoo Authority. Afterwards, the Central Zoo Authority shall withdraw and the large zoos followed by medium and small zoo in the country shall join the ZIMS and use it.

The Species 360 [erstwhile International Information Species System (ISIS)] is a nonprofit entity. It maintains computer based information system since 1989 used by the worldwide Zoo community. The organization provides its members with zoological data collection and management software called ZIMS - the Zoological Information Management

System (ZIMS). Its members use the basic biological information (age, sex, parentage, place of birth, circumstances of death etc.) collected in the ZIMS software system to manage genetic and demographic programme for the animal collections. As of 2017, the ZIMS database contains information on 21,000 species, 6.8 million animals, and 75 million medical records collected in the system to care for and manage their animal collections (including demographic and genetic management in many cases). It is also used for ex-situ breeding programs and supporting conservation research and programs. The ZIMS is a unified global, first of its kind collection of data base on captive animals, upkeep and their health management. The zoos and animal conservation organization of the world, which are working for captive care of animals, can become a member of Species 360 by payment of annual membership fee and they share current data about their collection in the software.

After the approval of competent authorities, the Memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed with ISIS (now Species 360) on 31.12.2008 for five year from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2009. In total 61 organizations were covered under the MoU which includes 57 zoos and four related institutions (Central Zoo Authority; Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun; Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Bareilly and Laboratory for Conservation of Endangered Species (LaCONES), Hyderabad. It was observed that most of the zoos and the institutions sponsored by the CZA were either not using the software at all or are not submitting their data to the Species 360. It was decided that the CZA shall pay fee only for those zoos that are submitting the data and shall not pay the fee of the zoos that are not using and updating the software of Species 360. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Central Zoo Authority and the Species 360 with slight changes was further extended for a period of five years (upto 31.12, 2018). The 32 zoos and 4 related institutions were covered for an amount of US \$ 2,10,000 that includes membership and trainings for five years.

In the year 2016, the CZA reviewed the usage of ZIMS software/s by the concerned zoos in the animal record keeping. The updated data record of respective zoos in the ZIMS software and their usage, total number of animals housed in the zoos as per their inventory report (2014-15) and the number of trainings imparted to the zoo personnel was reviewed. It was observed that majority of the 32 zoos had not achieved any success in updating the data except a few. The progress was observed not satisfactory commensurate with the expenditure and the efforts made by the CZA for the facilitation of record keeping in scientific manner by the selected zoos.

Accordingly, the Chief Wildlife Warden of the concerned States were requested to direct the Director of the respective member zoo to achieve the aim of data record keeping to its maximum within the time limit of two months after receipt of the letter. Simultaneously, the Country representative of the Species 360 was asked to help and support the respective zoos

by personally visiting the zoo, if required, by any zoo. Subsequently, it was also decided to conduct the interactive session for zoo personnel handling the work in small groups. The participant of the training was restricted to the person actually handling the data in the zoo and responsible for updation of information on the ZIMS software. These small group sessions were organized at Ranchi, Darjeeling, Kanpur, Chennai and Ahmedabad in the year 2016.

During the financial year 2017-18, the Central Zoo Authority in association with Species360, USA organized thirteen regional hands-on trainings for the data updation in its software, Zoological Information Management System (ZIMS) for the member zoos in India at Nehru Zoological Park, Hyderabad (8-9 May, 2017), Dr. Shyamaprasad Mukharjee Zoological Garden, Surat (11-12 May, 2017), Kanpur Zoological Park, Kanpur (16-17 May, 2017); Sanjay Gandhi Biological Park, Patna (22-23 May, 2017), National Zoological Park, New Delhi (26-27 May, 2017) and Sepahijala Zoological Park, Agartala (29-30 May, 2017) and at the Kamala Nehru Zoological Garden, Kankeria, Ahmedabad (5-6 February, 2018); the Sanjay Gandhi Zoological Park, Patna (12-13 February, 2018); the Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Bareilly (19-20 February, 2018);the Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Vandalur, Chennai (05-06 March, 2018); the M. C. Zoological Park, Chhatbir (08-09 March, 2018); the Veermata Jijabai Bhosale Udyan & Zoo, Mumbai (12-13 March, 2018) and Assam State Zoo & Botanical Garden, Guwahati (19-20 March, 2018). The participants from 30 identified zoos across the country attended this training.

As a result of these sessions, the progress improved and the zoos were benefitted. A comparative statement of the data entered in the ZIMS software by the member Indian zoos for a few previous consecutive years is given below:

# 7.3 International Co-operation

During the current financial year, the Central Zoo Authority has extended the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Smithsonian National Zoological Pak, Washington, D.C., USA for further three years w.e.f. on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2017. Under the MoU both the organization shall develop and implement joint research studies focused on animal health

and capacity building. Under the MoU, the Central Zoo Authority in association with Smithsonian National Zoological Park, Washington D.C., USA has organized a training programme on "Capacity Building of Indian Zoo Veterinarians" at National Zoological Park, New Delhi held 11 to 19 September 2017 in two batches. In total 35 numbers of veterinarians from 35 various Indian zoos benefitted from the programme.

#### 8.0 Research & Education

## 8.1 Extension of the MoU between CZA and the IVRI, Bareilly

The Central Zoo Authority has extended the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Central Zoo Authority and the Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Izatnagar, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh as "National Referral Centre on Wildlife Healthcare" by another five years w.e.f. 01.04.2017 to 31.03.2022 so that technical advice, guidance and assistance to the zoos is available in the field of wildlife healthcare continuously.


### 8.2 Extension of the MoU between CZA and the LaCONES, CCMB, Hyderabad

The Central Zoo Authority has extended Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi & the Laboratory for Conservation of Endangered Species (LaCONES), Centre for Cellular & Molecular Biology (CCMB), Hyderabad to take up research activities on "Conservation of endangered animals using biotechnological tools" by another five years w.e.f. 01.04.2017 to 31.03.2022 to take up research activities accordingly.

### 8.3 Research Projects

During the previous year the Central Zoo Authority reviewed the status of all research projects funded by the CZA and it was observed that many research projects are not progressing satisfactorily as per the time line mentioned in the project proposal submitted to the CZA for financial assistance. The Central Zoo Authority has provided opportunity to concern zoos to submit the final draft report to the Central Zoo Authority for approval. However, except a few zoos, most of the zoos were not able to submit the draft final report to the Central Zoo Authority. The Central Zoo Authority has reviewed the report submitted by zoos at any stage of the project as per the MoU of the project. The observations on the project report alongwith the status of the project was considered for taking the decision on following project. The details of such projects are mentioned below:

### 10.0 Financial assistance to Zoos


The Central Zoo Authority has received Rs 11.50 Cr as grant-in-aid during the financial year 2017-18 from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India. Out of this, Rs. 8.80 Cr was for improvement and development of the zoos and Rs. 1.70 Cr for salaries of the CZA establishment. It included fund for the development of zoos in North Eastern India also. The entire grant was utilized to achieve its objectives and mandate, broadly under the head of Development of zoos, Conservation Breeding, Rescue & Rehabilitation, Research and Training and Operational cost.

### 10.1 Improvement of zoos

During the financial year 2017-18, the Central Zoo Authority has released Rs. 9,27,88,600/- for improvement of zoos including the maintenance of the Rescue Centres, Conservation Breeding, Research & Trainings etc. as per the details given below:

#### 10.2 Grants released to Rescue Centers

The Government of India banned the display of lions, tigers, leopards, bears and monkeys in the circus in India through a notification issued on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 1998. The basic objective of imposing the ban was to provide congenial upkeep, housing and healthcare facilities to these animals keeping with the spirit of National Zoo Policy. The Central Zoo Authority had to assume the responsibility to rescue and rehabilitate these animals. The number of lions, tigers, leopards, bears and monkeys rescued from the circuses at that point of time was 375, 96, 21, 37 and 20 respectively. Keeping in view, the housing and upkeep requirements of these rescued animals and the non-availability of such facility in the existing zoos of the country, it was felt to set up separate facility for these animals across the country.

Accordingly, the Government of India agreed to create designated rescue facilities for these animals. The CZA was assigned the responsibility and requisite budgetary allocations were made in the budget of the Central Zoo Authority in the year 1999-2000. After finalizing the designs and enclosures of these facilities, seven rescue centres were created for these animals at Bangalore, Chennai, Tirupati, Vishakhapatnam, Bhopal, South Khairbari and Jaipur. The day to day operation and maintenance of these rescue centres has been assigned to the nearby zoo concerned in whose campus such facility has been set up. It is a life time care facility for these animals.

The Central Zoo Authority is continuously providing financial grant to the concerned zoos for operation and maintenance of these seven rescue centres. The grants are being given for feed, upkeep and health care of these animals. The laid down standard and norms in this regard are being strictly followed.

Over the years, after setting up of these rescue centres, the animals has died due to natural process and at present the number of rescued lions and tigers from the circuses has come down to 47 and 8 respectively.

During the financial year 2017-18, the Central Zoo Authority has provided an amount of Rs. 2.70 Cr for upkeep, feed and medicine etc. to six Rescue Centres as per the details mentioned below:

- 9. In the budget allocation of CZA for the year 2016-17 for salaries was Rs. 225.00 lakhs. However, due to non-operational of the 5 Regional Offices and non-implementation of 7th CPC recommendations, Rs. 1,39,03,848/- could be utilized from the said grant-in-aid during the year. The unutilized fund of Rs. 85,96,152/- has been refunded to the PAO, MOEF&CC at the end the financial year.

### Separate Audit Report on the Accounts of Central Zoo Authority, New Delhi for the year ended 31 March, 2018

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Central Zoo Authority (CZA), as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 38E of the Wildlife (Protection)Act, 1972. These financial statements are the responsibility of the CZA's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This draft Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, in conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material mis-statements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
  - (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
  - (ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance.

- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the CZA as required under Section 38E of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that:

#### A. Balance Sheet

#### 1. Assets

#### 1.1 Fixed Assets 'Rs. 37.53 lakh'

The intangible asset 'Computer Software' which was depreciable at the rate of 60 percent i.e. Rs. 4.68 lakh during 2017-18. However, the Authority had under-charged the depreciation of only Rs. 1.95 lakh (at the rate of 25 percent). This had resulted in overstatement of fixed assets by Rs. 2.73 lakh besides understatement of expenditure by the same extent.

#### 1.2 Current Assets 'Rs. 182.11 lakh'

An expenditure of Rs. 2.73 lakh incurred towards annual membership fee for the year 2018 (January to December 2018) to International Associations (viz. Rs. 1.94 lakh to World Association of Zoos and Aquariums (WAZA) and Rs. 0.79 lakh to Conservation Planning Specialist Group (CPSG)) instead of taking the proportionate amount of Rs. 2.05 lakh as 'Prepaid Expenses' under 'Current Assets'. This had resulted in understatement of Current Assets besides overstatement of expenditure both by Rs. 2.05 lakh.

#### B. Income & Expenditure Account

#### 1. Expenditure 'Rs. 1280.72 lakh'

(i) CZA booked an amount of Rs. 8.70 lakh under towards Establishment and Other Administrative Expenses which pertained to the period 2016-17. Thus, CZA had overstated the expenditure during 2017-18 on account of these items (Salary for March 2017, telephone bills, petrol, water, staff allowances etc.) by Rs. 8.70 lakh besides understatement of prior-period expenditure by the same amount.

#### 2. Income 'Rs. 1270.54 lakh

2.1 Schedule–13 'Grants/Subsidies' pertaining to Income & Expenditure Account of CZA disclosed receipts of Rs. 103.25 lakh under the head 'Unspent balance of Grants-in-aid refunded by Zoos during 2017-18'. As any unspent balance of grants-in-aid provided by the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) needs to be depicted under Section–A(4)(i) 'Unspent Grants-in-Aid' by the CZA. Treating it as income by the Authority, during 2017-18 again, had resulted in overstatement of Income and understatement of current liabilities both by Rs. 103.25 lakh.

2.2 As per Recognition of Zoo Rules 2009, a zoo should make an application to the CZA three months before the expiry of the period of recognition alongwith a fee of Rs. 5000/-for renewal of recognition. There were 20 number of Zoo who did not apply within the prescribed limit and defaulted in timely submission of renewal-fee as on 31.3.2018. However, CZA did not take into account the accrued income of Rs. 1.00 lakh out of fee receivable from these entities which resulted in understatement of income besides understatement of current assets by Rs. 1.00 lakh.

#### C. General:

#### (i) Static balances

Scrutiny of the accounts revealed the static balances under various schedules of the balance sheets as detailed below:

These static balances were long standing in the accounts. As these amounts were required to be released/recovered (as the case may be), efforts may be made by the Authority to settle these balances that were kept pending without any justification.

#### (ii) Non-Provisioning for Terminal Benefits

CZA did not make any provision for 'Terminal Benefits' viz. Gratuity, Accumulated Earned Leaves' of its officers/officials and a 'Nil' balance was reflected in both Schedule-7 'Current Liabilities and Provisions' and/or Schedule-20 'Establishment Expenses' of the accounts.

#### D. Grants-in-Aid

CZA received grants-in-aid of Rs. 1150.00 lakh and Rs. 153.59 lakh as other receipts during 2017-18 besides an opening bank/imprest balance of Rs. 174.08 lakh. Out of total amount of Rs. 1477.67 lakh, the Authority had made payments of Rs. 1305.79 lakh, leaving a closing bank/imprest balance of Rs. 171.88 lakh.

#### E. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Member Secretary, CZA through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- (v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Accounts and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- a. In so far as it related to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the CZA, as at 31st March 2017 and
- b. In as far as it related to Income & Expenditure Accounts, of the *deficit* for the year ended on that date.

#### 'Annexure - I'

### 1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

Internal Audit of the Authority was required to be conducted by the internal audit wing of Principal Pay & Accounts Office of the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Control (MoEF&CC), New Delhi which was completed upto March 2017. A total number of 15 paras (four pertained to 2010-12 and 11 of 2012-17) were outstanding till date (July 2018).

### 2. Adequacy of the Internal Control System

- i. The Utilization Certificates (UCs) for Rs. 381.68 lakh were still awaited from 17 Zoos in respect of grants-in-aid released from 2008-09 to 2016-17.
- Bank Reconciliation Statement: CZA had furnished the bank reconciliation statement for the month of March/April 2018 which shows no outstanding cheque prior to February 2018.
- iii. Improper Budgeting: As per DDG 2018-19, CZA was allocated with Grants-in-aid of Rs. 11.50 crore during 2017-18 under the object head-31 'Grants-in-aid General' (Rs. 9.80 crore) and 36-Grants-in-aid Salaries' (Rs. 1.70 crore). Out of this, an amount of Rs. 8.33 crore released to various zoos which included Rs. 4.72 crore towards developmental work viz. construction of Veterinary Hospital, Construction of animal enclosures and standoff barriers etc. However, the CZA did not made its budgetary provisions while including these provisions for release of 'Grants-in-aid for creation of capital assets' under object head-35 and release the general purpose grant for these capital items which shows improper budgeting by the Authority.
- iv. Non-maintenance of record of assets created out of Grants-in-aid to institutions: As per GFR 233, assets created out of Grants-in-aid for creation of capital assets can be retained or disposed-off by the grantee institution with the prior approval of the Authority. However, the Authority did not maintain any record of the assets created out of grants provided for creation of capital assets to various grantee institutions.
- v. The provisional Utilisation Certificate(s) for the financial year 2017-18 in respect of the grants-in-aid received by the Authority from MoEF&CC were not sent as per Form 12-A (under Rule 238) of GFRs 2017.
- vi. Surprise check of Cash was not carried out despite repeatedly pointed-out in audit.

System of Physical Verification of Inventory 3.

The physical verification of consumable items has been conducted upto March 2018.

System of Physical Verification of Assets

The Physical verification of Assets have been carried out for the period upto March, 2018.

5. Regularity in payment of Statutory dues.

The Central Zoo Authority was regular in depositing statutory dues.
